Once we identify the issues our children are facing, we can begin to work on the whole child-cognitive, social, emotional and physical. Children who have been shaped by bad experiences often show anger, seclusion and fear. Positive relationships, more than anything, with an adult mentor and peer-to-peer, can begin to replace the negative responses of their past.

Our assistant principal, Mrs. Richard, from Eastern Hills Elementary acknowledged that, "LNF provides our students with the social skills like respect, courage and handling adversity. When our students are equipped with these skills, they have an opportunity to become successful members in the community." LNFI wants to come alongside schools to help address the needs of the whole child. We provide an environment every day to instill growth in the social and emotional development of each child in our program.

More than likely, schools cannot change the circumstances of our children. If we continue to equip them to manage their current situations, our children will not become another statistic and our nation will reach the level of academic achievement it is seeking.

INTERNATIONAL

LNFI supports Casa Hogar de Niños, an orphanage in Camargo, Mexico. This orphanage was established 11 years ago by Pastor Osdy Luna and his wife, Teresa. Currently, Camargo is housing 30 orphans between the ages of 6 and 22 years old. The children are allowed to stay at the orphanage up to the age of 18; with the exception to those who are pursuing higher education at the University. These children come from broken homes and traumatic experiences of abuse and neglect. Without your help, these children would have nothing at all. The Team will return in late Spring to visit the children.

In 2015, we built four homes, fully furnished for needy families living in Nopalera Colonia. This year, we will continue to invest in the lives of families in need. For only \$4,500, one house can be built and furnished; A house that becomes a home to a family in Mexico and a home that changes their lives forever! The Team plans to return to build another home in early summer. Please consider supporting our great work in Mexico!
